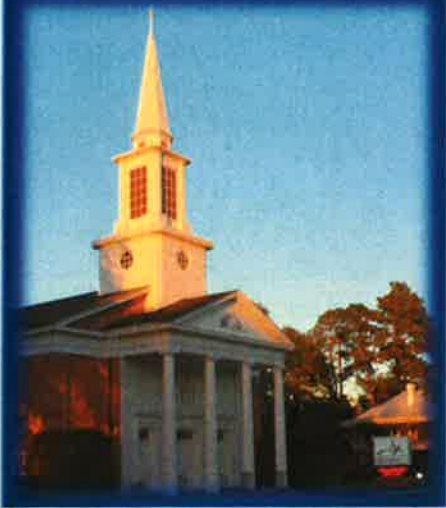

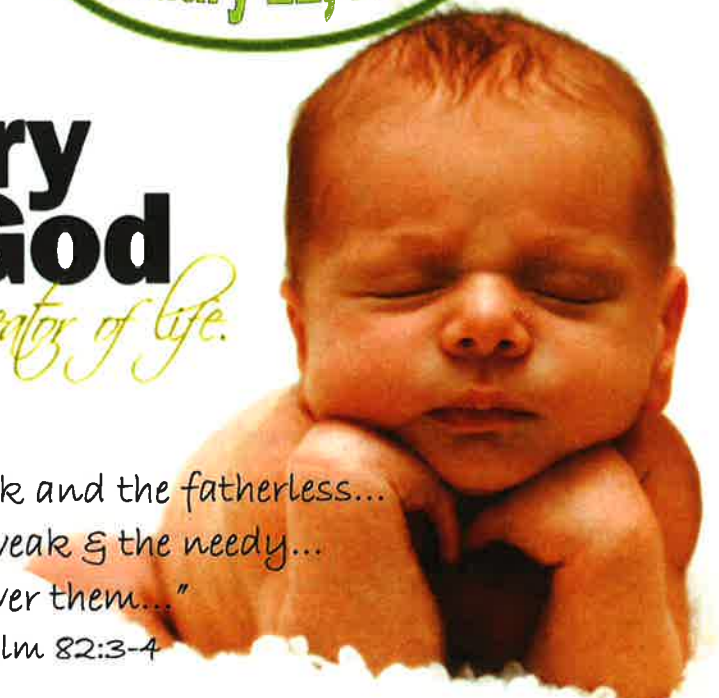

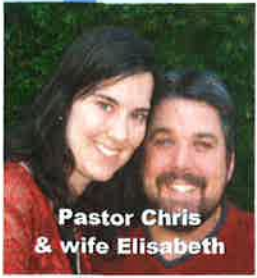

The clock says 10:55 p.m. on January 12th. I've just finished some Hebrew homework and I'm heading to bed to get a few winks before the alarm goes off at 5 a.m. I thought I'd reconnect with the "real" world and send a note to say, "Yes, I am still alive." The past two weeks have been a blur and feel like one long day. I told my professor one morning as I entered class that this J-term class felt like the movie Ground Hog Day. The same thing over and over and over. I purposefully disconnected myself from as much as possible to focus on school. So, I do feel out "out-of-the-loop". This class has been intense and truthfully, difficult. I know many are wondering, "How's it going?" So, here is a quick synopsis. I have three class days left, two quizzes, two homework assignments, and a final exam. I am passing and doing fine. Just like Greek, Hebrew is a tough class. And, to cram it into two and a half weeks is even tougher. Not to mention that even when I pass this class I still have more to go. I will be taking Hebrew 2 online this Spring.

So, by May I'll be done with languages and can pick up the pace to finish school. I wanted to take more classes this Spring but the demand that Hebrew requires is just too all-encompassing to try and do another class as well. After this semester, I intend to take more at a time. I will only have 6 or 7 classes left. So, I could (conceivably) finish in 2018. Here's hoping.

"What have you learned?" Thanks for asking. Well, I'm no Hebrew expert and never will be. To be honest, I'm just trying to survive. There is so much info I can't remember or process yet and that makes exams tough. (I'm getting too old for this.) But, I have gained a greater love and appreciation for God's word, His sovereignty, and the importance of "rightly dividing the word of truth" through deeper study of the Scriptures. I hope to return ready to preach again and minister again to the flock and field God's called me to. Every prayer has been and is appreciated. Your patience and support is appreciated as well.

So, off to bed I go. Six hours sleep ought to do me good. It's more than I've been getting! Keep faithful to the One who is forever faithful to us.
